2024 STUDENT MINISTRY

As we reflect on the accomplishments of our Student Ministry in 2024, we are grateful for your generous donations to our Youth Fund, which have enabled us to sponsor every child for every event!

- Summer Retreat Camp: We fully funded a week-long summer retreat at the Warren Willis United Methodist Youth Camp for all children and youth attendees, as well as support staff. This experience provided invaluable spiritual growth and fellowship for our young participants.

Finance 2024 Report

- 2024 Giving increased 12.7% over 2023. Thank you!
- This nearly brings us back to pre-Covid levels.
- However, because of delayed FEMA and IRS reimbursements, we have a cash deficit for the year that will be carried into 2025.
- Year-end gifts satisfied our Faith and Future mortgage goal.
- Our mortgage can now be closed, but only after we receive FEMA funds for IAN and close our building loan.
- Any additional gifts for Faith and Future will go towards closing the Ian loan.

Hurricane Ian Recovery

- lan damage cost to date is \$840,727.
- 2024 damage repairs were \$214,000, only partially offset by \$15,000 received from FEMA.
- 2024 work: replaced carpeting, interior cabinetry, drywall, roofing, soffit, and gutters, plumbing and painting.
- Our total restoration costs have exceeded our insurance proceeds and FEMA reimbursements by \$111,000.
- We will be making significant additional claims to FEMA in 2025.

2024 Worship Report

- Meaningful Worship Services: In the first part of the year, we had a meaningful blended worship service. Beginning in November, our growth allowed us the opportunity to return to two services; a traditional one at 9:00 and a contemporary service at 11:00.
- Youth Music Camp: Thanks to generous donations, we were able to provide keyboards, equipment, and meals, creating a supportive environment and an opportunity to sing during worship for our young musicians. We anticipate that this initiative will expand in the new year, further engaging our youth in worship.
- Musical Events: Throughout the year, we hosted several musical events, including a spectacular Christian rock concert by Petra which brought our community together for a night of praise and celebration.
- Christmas Worship: We finished the year with our annual Christmas Eve Candlelight service which featured moving music from our choir and a string quartet. It was a beautiful time of worship, filling our congregation with the warmth and joy of the season.



Faith Community Nurse Program

In 2025, new programs aimed at enhancing community well-being were initiated by our Faith Community Nurse, Jacquelyn Kelley.

- Health and Wholeness Events:
 Faith Church has hosted various health and wellness events and support groups, providing valuable resources to our congregation and community.
- Pet Ministry: A new and popular Pet Ministry has been launched, which now includes puppy training and dog obedience training, fostering connections among pet owners.
- Support Groups: We continue to provide meeting space for essential support groups such as Al-Anon and AA, as well as hosting a Parkinson event in collaboration with Lee Health. Additionally, Weekly Grief Share and Cancer Survivor Support groups have been established to offer support to those in need.
